## VISA CHECKLIST

### FAMILY REASONS VISA WITH EU CITIZENS (LONG STAY, OVER 90 DAYS)

In order to lodge an appointment, applicants are required to attempt to book an appointment using the [PRENOT@MI](mailto:PRENOT@MI) application available on our website.

REQUIREMENTS	CHECK
1 Applicants must be citizens or permanent residents of New Zealand, Tuvalu, Samoa, Tonga, Niue, Cook Islands, Kiribati, and Pitcairn.	
2 Applicants must be family members of EU\EEA citizens residing in Italy or who will reside in Italy.	
3 Applicants must fall under one of the following categories (Dlgs 30/2007, art.2): <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Spouses;</li><li>- The partner who has entered into a registered partnership with the Union citizen under the legislation of a Member State;</li><li>- Direct descendants under the age of 21 (children) or dependents if over 21 or disabled, and those of the spouse or partner;</li><li>- Direct ascendants who are dependents, and those of the spouse or partner.</li></ul>	
4 All documents must be printed out and presented in original plus a photocopy where required.	
5 Applicants are required to appear in person at all times.	
6 Once in Italy, applicants must register with the local Anagrafe (Registry Office) and apply for a residence card at the relevant Questura within 8 working days from their arrival.	

DOCUMENTS		CHECK
1	Printed and completed <a href="#">National Visa Application Form</a> .	
2	Current passport with at least 3 months' residual validity after the visa expiry date (the passport must have 2 blank pages on which the visa will be affixed).	
3	Valid NZ Residence Permit (for applicants that are not NZ citizens).	
4	1 recent passport-size photo. <a href="#">ICAO</a>	
5	Proof of relationship: marriage/civil partnership/birth certificate (original plus one photocopy). Please, note: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- marriage/civil partnership certificates older than 6 months will NOT be accepted;</li> <li>- certificates issued by a foreign authority other than the NZ, MUST be translated in English or Italian and legalised by the Italian Consular Office of the issuing Country OR by the Consular Authority in NZ of the issuing Country.</li> </ul>	
6	A letter from the Italian/EU citizen addressed to the Embassy of Italy in Wellington, stating the family relationship, requesting that a visa be issued to the applicant who will join him/her in Italy and the address where they will reside. AND A copy of the Italian/EU citizen's passport.	
7	For dependents: most recent tax return listing the applicant\s as dependent\s or proof of economic remittances.	
8	In case of minors, written consent from the other parent granting permission to travel. Please, note: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- the parental consent must be notarised by a NZ notary;</li> <li>- if the parent lives abroad, the consent must be notarised by the Italian Consulate of their country of residence (please visit the following website <a href="https://www.esteri.it/it/servizi-oppportunita/italiani-all-estero/traduzione-e-legalizzazione-documenti/">https://www.esteri.it/it/servizi-oppportunita/italiani-all-estero/traduzione-e-legalizzazione-documenti/</a>). This also applies when parents living abroad nominate a guardian;</li> <li>- a photocopy of both parents' passports must be provided.</li> </ul>	
9	<b><u>Family members of EU\EEA citizens residing in Italy or who will reside in Italy are exempt of the visa fee.</u></b>	
10	Prepaid self-addressed courier envelope with attached "Courier with Signature" label (to be purchased separately). For Rural deliveries please include also a "Rural Delivery label" (also purchased separately).
